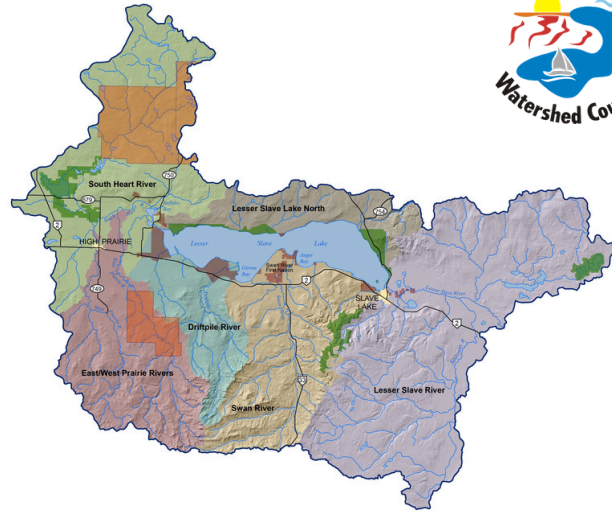
We bring together municipalities, Indigenous communities, industry, and residents to support sustainable water and land management through science, education, and partnerships.

- Provide oversight and direction to the Executive Director
- Act as an ambassador for LSWC within your sector and community

We are seeking individuals who:

- Care about the long-term health of our watershed and communities
- Value collaboration, respect, and diverse perspectives

Commitment

Term: 2 years (eligible for re-election)

Compensation: Volunteer position (expenses such as mileage may be reimbursed).
